Director's Notes

"Annie Get Your Gun" is the ageless, love story of sharp shooters Annie Oakley and Frank Butler. Annie Get Your Gun scored a bull's eye when it returned to Broadway in 1999 with the revised Peter Stone book which provides a show within a Wild West Show full of laughs and crafted for our time. The new book allows the production to depart from realism to unapologetic entertainment. Joined to the new book is that amazing Irvin Berlin score featuring hit after memorable hit claimed as his greatest achievement in theatre. The show opens with the well-loved "No Business Like Show Business" — a number that will fire audience expectations for the rest of the show.

She's been having a blast playing the woodsy gun-slinging Annie in this proper old-fashioned show and would like to thank the team at Queanbeyan Players, her singing teacher Jenni Reeves and her show widower Steve for all their support.

Richard Block – FRANK BUTLER

Richard came to theatre late in life not performing in his first show until he was 31 in Phoenix Player's production of *Kiss Me Kate (2006)*. The following years saw him perform in a succession of shows ranging from musicals, plays and pantomimes. He had roles in more than 20 shows in the chorus, as a pit singer, playing minor roles and most recently as understudy for Javert in Canberra Philharmonic's production of *Les Miserables (2013)*. Annie Get Your Gun marks Richard's first time as the leading man in a show. "I'm both terrified and excited. Musical Director's Notes

Irving Berlin has an honoured place in American music that still shines through to this day, through songs such as 'God Bless America' or 'White Christmas'. However, unlike many other musical theatre composers of his time Berlin was not musically trained. While Richard Rodgers and Jerome Kern went studied music at a tertiary level, Irving Berlin learnt on the job.

Although this limited him to some extent – he was unable to notate music and had to hire people to do that job for him – it also freed him from the shackles of tradition. Berlin brought a fluid, natural approach. Through his direct experience of which types of music people liked, Berlin was able to create songs which would become timeless.

You will hear Berlin's trademarks – well-crafted melodies supported by harmonies which are sophisticated but not classical. While they are not technically perfect, they sound 'right' and are pleasing to hear. You will also hear how advanced his understanding of the musical theatre form was through the use of themes and motifs throughout the show.

In regards to this particular production, it was interesting to work without individual microphones. The amateur scene in Canberra has embraced more modern shows, especially rock shows. Due to the impossibility of doing those shows without individual microphones, it has become the norm to have the cast miked. However, working on this show without mics has allowed us to explore the old ways – of cast-orchestra interaction and mutual sympathy to produce a better musical outcome for all.

Annie Oakley 1860 - 1926

Annie Oakley was born Phoebe Ann Moses in 1860 the 6th of seven children. She began shooting and hunting at the age of 8, selling the hunted game to hotels and restaurants. She paid off her widowed mother's mortgage by the time she was 15 years old



Frank Butler's original \$100 bet would be worth US\$2091 today. He missed the 25th shot and lost the bet but began courting 15 year old Annie.



Annie Oakley

On her world tour, Oakley shot the ash of the cigarette held by Kaiser Wilhelm II. Some suggested if she had shot him and not the cigarette she may have prevented WWI. He declined a second invitation to be a target for Annie!

Annie taught upwards of 15000 women how to use a gun. She said "I would like to see every woman know how to handle guns as naturally as they know how to handle babies".







During her lifetime complimentary theatre tickets had two holes punched in them and were referred to as "Annie Oakley's" because they were reminiscent of the playing cards Annie shot at.

Annie died on 3 November 1926. Frank Butler, her husband, stopped eating and died of starvation 18 days later on 21 November 1926.

"Her presence would remind you Of an angel in the skies And I bet I love this little girl With the raindrops in her eyes"

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












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
